May 18, 2015

A special meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Greenville was held on Monday, May 18, 2015, at 5:30 pm at Pioneer Hall, to address the 2015 Zoning Draft. Four board members were present after Councilman Bensen arrived at 5:45 pm. Attorney Tal Rappleyea, Zoning Office Mark Overbaugh, and 3 guests were in attendance. Supervisor Macko opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Comments received from Greene County Planning Department, as well as from members of the Town's Planning and Zoning Board of Appeals, were reviewed. Additional time will be necessary to discuss these concerns;

Mr. Bear moved to hold a special meeting on Monday, June 1, 2015 at 5:30 pm in Town Hall to continue this review of the 2015 draft zoning law, seconded by Mr. Davis.

Carried 4 ayes

Auditing of the monthly bills began at 7:15 pm, followed by the regularly scheduled Town Board meeting at 7:30 pm. Four board members continued in attendance, as well as Attorney Rappleyea and 8 guests. The Pledge of Allegiance was repeated.

Supervisor Macko reviewed the bids received on May 5, 2015 related to the Sewer Extension:

Mr. Bensen moved to adopt the resolution, attached, awarding contracts related to the sewer extension, seconded by Mr. Bear.

Contract 1, Sewer Extension: American Evergreen, Inc., for \$2,243,446.00 Contract 2, Plant and Pump Station: J Squared Construction Corp., for \$2,295,000.20 Contract 3, Electrical Construction: Brunswick Electric, Inc., for \$323,325.00 Contract 4, HVAC: D&E Contractors and Plumbing, LLC, for \$34,585.00 Contract 5, Plumbing: D&E Contractors and Plumbing, LLC, for \$4.150.00

Mr. Davis moved to accept the Clerk's minutes of April 20, 2015 and May 5, 2015, seconded by Mr. Bensen. Carried 4 ayes

Oral and written reports were received from the Highway, Buildings and Grounds, Code, Planning and Zoning Boards, Sewer and Water departments. Additionally, Mr. Leroy Bear addressed the need to purchase safety material for the Norton Hill and Vanderbilt Park playground areas. The lowest bid was the State bid price of \$2,155 for 80 cubic yards of this material.

Mr. Bensen moved to purchase this material, seconded by Mr. Bear.

Carried 4 ayes

Town of Greenville minutes of May 18, 2015

Code Officer Overbaugh addressed the fee schedule currently in use, and proposed adding a residential "accessory building" line, at \$0.125/square foot, keeping the minimum building permit fee unchanged at \$50.

Mr. Bear moved to allow this addition, seconded by Mr. Davis.

Carried 4 ayes

Issues related to water usage was discussed. No motions were made.

The Greene County Household Hazardous Waste Collection event will occur on June 6th.

The Zoning Board of Appeals would like to change their standing meeting times from 6:00 pm to 6:30 pm, still on the second Tuesday of each month.

Mr. Bensen moved to allow this change in schedule, seconded by Mr. Davis. Carried 4 ayes

New business discussed at 7:55 pm:

The Memorial Day parade will occur on Monday, May 25th, stepping off at 10:15 am, followed by the ceremony at Veteran's Park at approximately 10:45 am.

A proposal to replace our Automatic External Defibrillator was reviewed. The unit in Town Hall currently available is dated 2003; upgrades and parts are unavailable, and this unit is considered outdated. A replacement quote from Cardiac Life was received for \$1,440, including a locked and alarmed wall-box.

Mr. Bear moved to purchase this unit, seconded by Mr. Bensen.

Carried 4 ayes

Supervisor Macko relayed information on the DCO software program available through BAS. After discussion, this expenditure will be revisited with the next budget cycle. Also discussed was an opportunity to upgrade lighting through a program offered at no charge to municipalities through Central Hudson. Mr. Macko has made arrangements to follow through on this opportunity.

The Camp Malka escrow account balance is low;

Mr. Davis moved for Attorney Rappleyea to arrange replenishment of this account, seconded by Mr. Bensen.

Carried 4 ayes

Maintenance Supervisor Leroy Bear discussed the need to replace a 2008 Tank mower. Four bids have been obtained, and he recommended the Exmark E series with 52" deck, for \$7,237. Despite being \$87 over the lowest bid, this machine is better suited for the Town's needs.

Mr. Bear moved, seconded by Mr. Davis, to purchase the Exmark mower.

Carried 3 ayes; Mr. Bensen recused himself, as his business is the seller of the Kubota mower.

Mr. Davis moved to enter executive session at 8:10 pm to discuss collective bargaining negotiations per Article 14 of Civil Service Law, seconded by Mr. Bensen.

Carried 4 ayes

Mr. Davis moved to return to regular session at 8:32 pm, seconded by Mr. Bensen. Carried 4 ayes

No motions were made in executive session.

Elaina Spahmer of local Girl Scout Troop #1407 presented her Gold Award project to the Board, which addresses the issue of obesity. She plans on placing fitness markers along the trails in Vanderbilt Park in order to encourage increased activity, and will create a pamphlet and write articles for the local papers to publicize these markers. Supervisor Macko stated she had the support of the Town Board in this worthwhile endeavor.

Mr. Macko opened the meeting for public comments & questions: none received.

A special meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Greenville was held on Monday, June 1, 2015, at 5:30 pm at Pioneer Hall, to address the 2015 Zoning Draft. Four board members were present after Councilman Bensen arrived at 5:40 pm; Councilman Stern was absent. Attorney Tal Rappleyea, Zoning Office Mark Overbaugh, and 8 guests were in attendance. Supervisor Macko opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Changes made after last month's evaluation of the Greene County Planning Department's recommendations were reviewed. Zoning Board of Appeals member Sandy Garden presented his concerns to the Board, which were discussed. Supervisor Macko urged residents to attend the public hearing once scheduled.

Attorney Rappleyea left the meeting at 6:15 pm.

In other business, Councilman Bear moved to accept an Appropriation and Transfer of Funds Resolution, attached, seconded by Councilman Davis.

Mr. Bear moved to accept a Resolution Establishing Standard Workday for Elected and Appointed Officials, attached, seconded by Mr. Davis.

Carried 4 ayes

Code Officer Overbaugh has obtained quotes for a replacement copier for Town Hall; nine models were presented from four companies. All quotes were less than expected. There is money in the Pioneer Account available for this use. Comparisons were reviewed and discussed.

Mr. Davis moved to purchase either the Toshiba Studio 357 or the EBP Lanier MP3554, whichever was determined to be best suited for the needs of our office. Seconded by Mr. Bear.

Carried 4 ayes

Code Officer Overbaugh reviewed ongoing issues related to Camp Malka. Mr. Kaplan, Director of Operations at the Camp, has assured us that design specifications will be received at our office by Tuesday, June 02, 2015. Discussion ensued; paperwork pertaining to the fire suppression system has been requested for several years now without result.

Mr. Davis moved to have Code Officer Overbaugh contact Camp Malka with notification that unless plans with calculations and necessary modifications were received by 4:00 pm Wednesday, June 3, 2015, the Town Attorney will prepare a letter stating Camp Malka cannot operate for the 2015 season. Seconded by Mr. Bear.

Mr. Alan Tavenner of Delaware Engineering presented the Board with an amended Map, Plan and Report for the extension of sewer district #1. Overages for approximately \$730,000 have occurred after the bids for work were received.

Mr. Bear moved, seconded by Mr. Bensen, to accept the resolution and order accepting Amendment No. 2 to the Map, Plan and Report and scheduling a public hearing on June 15, 2015 at 6:00 pm in Pioneer Town Hall concerning the increase in the estimated maximum amount of the Extension to Sewer District #1 to a total cost of \$6,400,000., pursuant to sections 202-b and 209-h of Town Law.

Update: May 2015

Planning Board May 26, 2015

Greenville Drive In: Dwight Grimm 10700 SR 32 Tax Map #24.04-1-8

Mr. Grimm & his wife plan to reopen the drive in with the addition of a small dining area with a liquor license. Their goal is to serve local food and beverages. Making a community orientated environment. The new outside garden area would consist of fencing, planters, and outdoor tables and chairs. At this time the plan for the flooring is gravel or mulch. Mr. Grimm is also trying to present the drive in as a venue that can be used for a variety of events; retirement parties, graduations, etc. There is a new projection screen that is also being installed. They plan to show a mix of new, old, independent, and retro movies throughout the season. The Board reviewed all paperwork presented and consulted with the Zoning Laws. This property is already zoned for the applications requested by the applicant. The Board was unsure why the applicant needs a Site Plan Review & Change of Use Permit. The Board was told that Tal wanted this to be presented to The Board because of the creation of the outside eating area.

Motion to accept the application for Dwight Grimm in regards to the Greenville Drive In was tabled until June 23, 2015. Mark Wilcox was unable to act on behalf of The Board for this case since he is the owner of the property.

DeFrancesco Site Plan Review & Special Use Permit Tax Map #24.02-4-27

Discussed time limit allowed between granting a Notice of Action with conditions and having those conditions met. Mr. DeFrancesco was in attendance at the meeting. He expressed how unhappy that he was with The Board and with Mark Overbaugh. After April's meeting Mark Overbaugh and our engineer went to the property to observe the septic concerns. They found that a new perk test would need to be done at the property. First perk test done came back with the result of 5 minutes. Mr. DeFrancesco raised question about what the average time on a perk test was. Mark responded with an answer of 1-90 minutes. Our engineer also found that the soil levels were between 0-12 inches and the sand levels were 12-72 inches; this he was not comfortable with. Mr. DeFrancesco refuses to have a new perk test done. Mark Wilcox was also unsure why a new perk would need to be done. He mentioned to Mr. DeFrancesco that he would take care of the situation and that Mr. DeFrancesco should stop making accusations toward Mark Overbaugh and The Board.

James Sullivan-Subdivision: 3339 & 3335 RT 67 Freehold Tax Map# 51.00-2-57.2 & 51.00-2-57.1 Board reviewed the map presented from the applicant. The applicant was given approval on June 27, 2006 from the Planning Board for his subdivision with conditions. Applicant would like to not follow through with the noted conditions. Board members were in agreement that those conditions need to be met; which states that a full survey would need to be done before the property can be sold. Tal is also in contact with the applicant and their atty.

Camp Malka

Mark Overbaugh (Code Enforcement Officer) gave an update on the situation. The camp has been told that they need to comply with the conditions of their NOA in regards to the fire suppression tank or that there is possibility that they will be unable to open for the season. Mark and our engineer have looked at the property and at this time they are waiting for official calculations on what size gallon tank is going to be needed. Original specs called for a 20,000-gallon tank. At this time the camp has \$100,000 in unpaid taxes. The Board mentioned thoughts of unpaid taxes no building permits allowed.

Gail Nicholsen & Tor Tryland- Area Variance @ 164 Fox Hill Road Tax Map #36.00-3-25

Mrs. Nicholsen & Mr. Tryland summarized their plans to build a pole barn on their property. It was discussed that the project does not meet the required guidelines for setbacks in the rear and to the side of the adjacent properties. The applicants are asking for a variance to adjust the setback on the side to 25ft and on the rear to 10ft.

Motion to accept the application for Gail Nicholsen & Tor Tryland for an area variance of setback requirements made by Art Marini. Seconded by: Sandy Garden. All in favor: 5, Opposed: 0, motion carried.

Motion to set a Public Hearing for Gail Nicholsen & Tor Tryland on June 9, 2015 at 6:30pm made by Tom Briggs. Seconded by: Art Marini. All in favor: 5, Opposed: 0, motion carried.

Cumberland Farms- Area Variance (Sign) 4887 SR 81 Greenville: Tax Map # 12.04-4-17

Ms. Carolyn Parker will be acting on behalf of Cumberland Farms. Ms. Parker of Cumberland Farms summarized her proposed plans in writing to seek approval to update existing signs on the store's property. The property is approximately 0.88 acres and is zoned Hamlet Business. Cumberland Farms plans to install updated gas pump signs and an updated large company name sign with intermittent lighting, which will change every 8 seconds. Cumberland Farms is asking The Board to be granted "5" sign variances to allow their signs to be updated and internally lite with intermittent lighting. The Board was presented with the plans, pictures, and requested variances. The Board discussed that "10" variances would need to be filed in order to have the paperwork for the requested changes be in proper order. They also discussed that the brightness of the new updated signs may need to be addressed.

Board members reviewed the plans and pictures, they also conducted a preliminarily review of the project; some conditions and concerns noted.

Motion to accept the application for Cumberland Farms with the condition that they file "10" area variances for updated sign approval made by Joan Smith. Seconded by: Sandy Garden All in favor: 6, Opposed: 0, motion carried.

The Board discussed that after further thought and looking more at Cumberland's plans they would be required to not file "10" variances, but file "6" variances in regards to the lighting of their updated signs. Ms. Parker presented The Board with a video of existing lighted signs they currently have at other properties.

Motion to change the numbers of sign variances required for Cumberland Farms' updated internally lite signs from "10" to "6" made by Art Marini. Seconded by: Sandy Garden. All in favor: 5, Opposed: 0, motion carried.

Motion to accept the application for Cumberland Farms for updated internally lite signs made by Art Marini. Seconded by: Tom Briggs. All in favor: 5, Opposed: 0, motion carried.

Motion to set a Public Hearing for Cumberland Farms on June 9, 2015 at 6:30pm made by Art Marini. Seconded by: Mike Schlenker. All in favor: 5, Opposed: 0, motion carried.

Sandy Garden - AreaVariance (Sign) 10756 RT 32 Greenville: Tax Map # 24.04-1-7.2

Mr. Garden summarized his proposed plans for the change of an existing sign. This existing sign would be at an off premise location. The location of the proposed sign is on property owned by Greene County Power Equipment. Mr. Garden plans to install a sign on the property however; no money will be changing hands for the sign to be posted. There is a letter on file from the owner of Greene Power Equipment giving their permission. Mr. Garden is asking the Board to grant a sign variance for an off the premise sign permit. The Board was presented with pictures of the sign in size and design. There was discussion over the fact that the location of this sign has been many others business advertisements in the past. Some of the Board mentioned disapproval with the request.

Board members reviewed the pictures, they also conducted a preliminarily review of the project; concerns were noted over the fact that the sign has had a high turnover of advertisers.

Motion to set a Public Hearing for Sandy Garden on June 9, 2015 at 6:30pm made by Art Marini. Seconded by: Tom Briggs. All in favor: 4, Opposed: 0, motion carried.

Zoning Laws

The Board discussed the new Zoning Laws that the Town Board will be voting on. There were concerns over the sign laws in regards to the wording. The Board's thoughts were that the wording should not just say "back-lite" but that the term "light omitting sign" should be used. The Board also feels that for a blinking sign there should be time period between blinking and changing. The Board would like to set up a date and time with all members as well as Mark Overbaugh & Paul Macko to discuss their concerns. No date has been set at this time.

NYSDEC endorsed Erosion and Sediment Control Required Training

Greene County Soil and Water Conservation District is pleased to be hosting a 4-Hour Training Course for Erosion and Sediment Control on Wednesday September 30, 2015 from 8:30am to 3:00pm.

Under the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation's Stormwater Permit GP-0-15-002, each contractor and subcontractor identified by the project owner as being responsible for the implementation of the SWPPP must identify at least one individual from their company that will be responsible for implementation of the SWPPP (i.e. trained contractor). The trained contractor must be on site on a daily basis when soil disturbance activities are being performed. Also, developers must have a qualified inspector conduct regular site inspections in accordance with GP-0-15-002.

Developers, planners, code enforcement officers, and anyone who is interested in learning more about erosion and sediment control requirements are also encouraged to attend this training. This course will review the new GP-0-15-002 permit, the requirements of stormwater pollution prevention plans, and the proper installation of erosion and sediment control practices. DOS- CEC is available for Code Enforcement Officers and Planning Board/Zoning Board members.

Upon completion of the course, each participant will receive NYS DEC Storm water Training Number on a certificate and wallet card good for 3 years. Individuals who successfully complete the DEC-endorsed 4-hour training course will be certified for three years.

Attached is a flyer and registration form. Registration forms, and the registration fee of \$65 per person, are due to GCSWCD by September 23, 2015. Registration fees include lunch. Feel free to make copies and forward the information on this course to anyone you feel may be interested in attending.



Trucks: Will utilize State Rtes 9W, 23 & 32


