### July 20, 2015

A workshop with the Town Board of the Town of Greenville and the Greenville Rescue Squad was held on Monday, July 20, 2015 at 5:30 pm at Pioneer Hall. Four board members were present; Councilman Stern was absent. There were 7 members of the Greenville Rescue Squad present (K. Aspenleiter, A. Scirico, F. Sickles, B. Toomey, R. Lang, T. Nugent, and C. Powell III), as well as 4 guests. Supervisor Macko opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Supervisor Macko presented available options to consider on providing EMS service to the Town. These include contracting with the Greenville Rescue Squad, the Durham Rescue Squad, or using the proposed County-wide system. Discussion ensued. Mr. Macko wants to offer the best service at the most reasonable cost. It was suggested the Town Boards of Durham and Greenville meet to discuss how a combined service could meet the needs of the residents in both towns. Supervisor Macko will follow up with Durham Town Supervisor Bill Carr.

This workshop was adjourned at 6:30 pm.

The regular monthly meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Greenville followed at 7:00 pm. Four board members continued in attendance; Attorney Tal Rappleyea and 12 guests were present as well. Supervisor Macko repeated the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Davis moved to accept the Clerk's minutes of June 15, 2015, seconded by Mr. Bensen. Carried 4 ayes

Oral and written reports were received from the Highway, Buildings and Grounds, Code, Planning and Zoning Boards, Sewer and Water departments. Additionally, concerns were brought to the Board's attention regarding discrepancies between the Town's fees at the Recycling Center and what Greene County charges. Appliances with Freon (Refrigerators, Freezers, Air Conditioners) are collected with a \$7.50 fee at the County site, and \$15.00 in Greenville.

Mr. Davis moved, seconded by Mr. Bear, to amend the fee schedule at our Recycling Center to be consistent with Greene County, and charge \$7.50 for appliances with Freon.

### Planning Board July 28, 2015

Tryland, Preisner & Gorch-Subdivision @ 158 Highland Rd Tax Map #25.00-2-24- Subdivision Since last month's meeting there were "2" notes added to new surveyed maps (note location plans). Negative declaration for the SEQRA. Subdivision approved with condition that The Board be presented with acceptable Mylar maps that will show the "notes location plan".

### Albert Vedder- Subdivision @ 710 Old Plank Rd Tax Map #23.00-5-25.11

Mr. Vedder was approved for a minor "3" lot subdivision on March 24, 2015. During the initial survey there was snow on the ground, which prevented accurate account of acreage. A new survey was completed and new maps drawn up. When the property lines were redone one of the divided lots (lot 1) was shorted 1.46 acres. Tal is aware of the situation and all paperwork is in order properly now. Approvable of the revised maps showing that the South side of Lot 1 in the Town of Durham, will increase in size by 1.46 acres because of a stonewall missed during the initial survey.



In response to your July 31, 2014 request, we reviewed Willowbrook Road and Willowbrook Drive in the Town of Greenville for speed limit reductions.

Based on our review we have determined that a 40 MPH speed limit is warranted on both these highways. We have written Notices of Order establishing these speed limits and have filed it with the Sectretary of State. Upon receipt of signed copies of these Orders, the Town of Greenville may arrange to have the appropriate speed limit signs installed in accordance with the NYS Supplement to the 2009 MUTCD.

In addition to the regulatory speed limit, the Town of Greenville may wish to conduct a review of this road to see if the addition of curve warning signs with reduced advisory speed panels would be beneficial.



### New Energy-Efficient Street Lighting Options Approved For Central Hudson — More LED Street Lighting Will Lower Taxpayer Costs and Help Improve the Environment —

ALBANY — The New York State Public Service Commission (Commission) today approved a plan by Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corp. to provide energy-efficient street lighting to municipalities that are interested in having them installed. Under the proposal, municipalities in Central Hudson's service territory will now have the option to switching to cost-effective LED street lighting as a means of reducing their power expenses, carbon footprint and improving public safety.

"The Central Hudson proposal is just the type of utility innovation that we hope to see throughout the State," said Chair Audrey Zibelman. "The adoption of LED lighting can save municipalities up to 60 percent of their electricity costs for street lighting. Historically, municipalities could only achieve these savings through their willingness to take over ownership of the street lights from the utility, an expenditure many communities found they could not afford. With the Central Hudson proposal, municipalities will be able to achieve these savings without burdening taxpayers or other utility consumers."

In 2010, the Commission approved an additional option to Central Hudson's tariff to offer an LED street light that would be owned and maintained by the municipality. Today's decision expands upon that decision with the addition of utility-owned street lights. With approval of the new LED options, Central Hudson will be able to offer municipal customers who use utility-owned street lights the option to convert to LED street lights that Central Hudson will own and maintain.

The utility will offer four LED fixtures, each at a different wattage; 39W, 82W, 93W, and 153W. The approval of the new LED street lighting fixtures will be welcomed news for the municipalities in the region that had been asking for such a new option. Central Hudson performed a cost study for each LED fixture to determine the annual fixture charge required to recover the revenue requirement over the expected life of each of the four LED fixtures.

The LED annual fixture charges are lower than the majority of current street lighting fixtures in the company's service territory. Including the energy savings, all fixture types are estimated to provide annual savings. The savings for the majority of fixture types that would be replaced range from approximately \$30 to \$90, annually, per street light. There are approximately 25,000 such street lights in Central Hudson's service territory. With total conversion, annual taxpayer savings could approach \$1.3 million annually.

As part of this push to improve energy efficiency, Central Hudson will be replacing no less than 15 percent of company-owned fixtures in any municipality and no less than 25 percent of the company-owned fixtures in the company's service territory, based on requested volume. As a result, all

municipalities could have company-owned and maintained LED fixtures within four years, an aggressive change-over, but one that is achievable.

As street lighting technologies continue to advance, it will be important to take advantage of additional functionalities that can improve costs and public safety, while meeting and balancing both the environmental and economic impacts of conversions. To that end, universal outreach and education will be a key component to the overall success of LED street light conversion. The Commission also specified its desire to see similar plans from other utilities in the State. In New York City's case, the City owns the street lights and began converting in 2009. It is scheduled to complete the conversion in 2017.


