June 15, 2015

A meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Greenville began at 6:00 pm on Monday, June 15, 2015, for the purpose of conducting a public hearing to hear all persons interested in the subject concerning the increase in the estimated maximum amount of the Extension to Sewer District # 1 and Improvements thereto, with a maximum total estimated cost of \$6,400,000. Four board members were present, as well as Engineer Alan Tavenner and 6 guests. Councilman Stern and Attorney Rappleyea were absent. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Tavenner provided a summary of the cost overages for this project after the bids for services were awarded. The totals provided were not inclusive of any grant money that may or may not be received.

Supervisor Macko asked if there were any interested persons present who desired to be heard. No one spoke in favor of or against the proposed increase of estimated maximum cost. There were several questions from residents **John Weinlich**, **Karen Bennett**, and **Gene** and **Lynn Bowden** pertaining to the cost for a particular home, the timing of project commencement, feared decrease in home market values after pump station is built, and logistics of the plant operations. No other comments were received.

Mr. Bensen moved to close the public hearing at 6:34 pm, seconded by Mr. Bear. Carried 4 ayes

The regular monthly meeting began at 7:00 pm at Pioneer Hall. All board members were in attendance at this time, as well as 12 guests. Supervisor Macko repeated the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Bensen moved to accept the Clerk's minutes of May 18, 2015 and June 1, 2015, seconded by Mr. Bear. Carried 5 ayes

Oral and written reports were received from the Highway, Buildings and Grounds, Code, Planning and Zoning Boards, Sewer and Water departments. Additionally, approval was requested for several training classes.

Mr. Bear moved, seconded by Mr. Bensen, to allow Code Officers Overbaugh and Silk to attend the Capital District NYSBOC conference relating to Solar Energy, at a cost of \$30 per person.

Carried 5 ayes

Mr. Davis moved, seconded by Mr. Bensen, to allow Highway Superintendent Hempstead and department employee Joseph Licata to attend a DEC Erosion and Sediment Control training course, at a cost of \$65 per person.

Carried 5 ayes

New business discussed at 7:40 pm: A town-wide yard sale will be held on July $17^{th} - 19^{th}$ this summer, to correlate with the annual sale held at Country Estates.

Another change to the Town fee schedule was noted, to decrease the cost of accessory buildings from \$0.25 to \$0.125 per square foot.

The Greene County Council of the Arts "Sprouts" Program requested a donation to help support this annual children's program.

Mr. Bear moved, seconded by Mr. Bensen, to donate \$300 to this cause. Carried 5 ayes

A very successful Relay for Life event occurred this month at Vanderbilt Park, raising close to \$35,000.

Mr. Macko relayed information about planned road work on SR 81 in the town of Earlton. Parts of that road will be closed between June 22^{nd} – July 3^{rd} .

Supervisor Macko opened the meeting for public comments and questions at 8:10 pm:

A presentation was offered by Mr. Jason Reinhard and Mr. Jared McAneny about the Greenville Youth Soccer program. Currently serving 261 children aged 5 – 14, the program continues to grow. The program runs 6 days per week in July and August, extending into the fall on Saturday mornings. It was stated that 100+ people are brought into town for these games, from across the region. Mr. McAneny requested the Town consider allowing the group to make improvements in the western field above the current soccer field, to level the area for an additional 3 fields. The presenters seek to make this an open and flat field for multiple groups to use, and are hoping for Town support in this endeavor.

Mr. Bensen moved, seconded by Mr. Stern, to allow the group to proceed.

Carried 5 ayes

Engineer Alan Tavenner again reviewed the sewer extension project to those in attendance.

Mr. Bear made a motion to reaffirm the SEQR Negative Declaration, seconded by Mr. Bensen. Roll call requested:

Mr. Bensen moved to accept the attached resolution approving the increase in the estimated maximum amount of extension and improvements to Greenville Sewer District #1 to \$6,400,000, pursuant to \$202-b and \$209-h of Town Law, subject to Permissive Referendum. Seconded by Mr. Bear. Roll call requested:

Supervisor Macko – aye

Mr. Bear – aye

Mr. Bensen - aye

Mr. Davis – aye

Mr. Stern - aye

carried 5 ayes

Mr. Tavenner discussed that although the Board voted aye, a 30 day public comment period was necessary. The sewer collection system work can proceed now; in the event negative public comments are received, plans at the wastewater treatment plant could be revised.

Mr. Bensen moved, seconded by Mr. Bear, to approve American Evergreen for the sewer excavation project work.

Carried 5 ayes

Supervisor Macko discussed recent conversations with the EFC. The Sewer BAN is due on 6/25/2015, and the closing with EFC for the 0% loan will not occur until late September. Therefore, an extension will be necessary.

Mr. Bensen moved to extend the BAN by another 6 months, for an additional \$1,250,000, in order to cover expenses until the 0% loan is closed with EFC. Seconded by Mr. Davis.

Carried 5 ayes

Mr. Andy Scirico of the Greenville Rescue Squad provided the Board with an updated budget, and requested a meeting with the committee to discuss a plan for the Town of Greenville. The proposed budget had been decreased to \$271,000. Supervisor Macko is willing to reopen discussion on this matter, but is concerned that the decreased dollar amount offered is still 1/6 the total amount to be raised by taxes.

A meeting will be held to discuss this issue prior to the regularly scheduled town

board meeting on Monday, July 20, 2015 at 5:30 pm in Pioneer Town Hall.

After audit, Mr. Davis moved, seconded by Mr. Stern, to pay the following bills:

WHEREAS, pursuant to a final order adopted March 7, 2013 (the "2013 Order"), as amended by a final order adopted November 17, 2014 (the "2014 Order"), the Town Board of the Town of Greenville, Greene County, New York (the "Town") approved the establishment of an amended extension to the Greenville Sewer District #1 including approximately 222 acres and approximately 135 parcels in the vicinity of NYS Rt. 32 and Rt. 81 (the "2013 Extension"), and

including 15 acres and 22 properties located along portions of Hill Street and County Route 26 (the "2014 Extension), (the 2013 Extension area modified by the 2014 Extension area is referred to herein as the "Extension"), all as more particularly described in the 2013 Order, the 2014 Order and the proceedings taken with respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, certified copies of the final 2013 Order and the final 2014 Order have been filed in the office of the Greenville Town Clerk and in the office of the Greene County Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Map, Plan and Report dated January 14, 2013, as amended by Amendment No. 1 to Map, Plan and Report dated September 22, 2014 (collectively the "Amended Map, Plan and Report") prepared by Delaware Engineering, P.C., a competent engineer duly licensed by the State of New York (the "Engineer"), provided for the construction of improvements to the sewer plant for Sewer District #1 and the modified design of the Extension and Improvements, including the upgrade to the existing wastewater treatment plant to increase the treatment capacity, installation of a gravity sewer collection system, construction of a pump station, and construction of a force main to the wastewater plan improvements as described in the Amended Map, Plan and Report, all at an estimated maximum cost of \$5,400,000; and

WHEREAS, at the request of the Town Board, the Engineer prepared an amendment to the Amended Map, Plan and Report dated June 1, 2015 (the "Amendment No. 2 to Map, Plan and Report"), and such amendment was duly filed in the office of the Town Clerk of the Town of Greenville and submitted to the Town Board; and

WHEREAS, the Amendment No. 2 to Map, Plan and Report provides for an increase in the estimated maximum cost of the proposed Extension and Improvements to \$6,400,000. Of such amount, approximately \$1,558,000 represents amounts allocable to the existing Sewer District #1 and the remaining approximately \$4,842,000 represents amounts allocable to the Extension area. The proposed method of apportioning the costs of the Extension area is to assess the costs entirely against the lands benefitted thereby, being the entire Extension Area; and to assess, levy and collect costs from the several lots or parcels within such benefitted area in just proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvement shall confer upon such lots or parcels. The plan of financing set forth in the Amended Map, Plan and Report, as amended by Amendment No. 2 to Map, Plan and Report, indicates that the Town anticipates the issuance of its obligations pursuant to the Local Finance Law and the receipt of a 0% loan from NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation ("NYSEFC") to pay such costs; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has heretofore declared the Extension and Improvements to be a Type I action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and declared its intent to be the lead agency, all of which was circulated to the interested and involved agencies as required by law, has heretofore determined that the Extension and Improvements would not have a negative effect on the environment after considering the potential environmental effects in accordance with SEQRA, and notice of such negative declaration was circulated to the involved agencies and published in the Environmental Notice Bulletin, and the Town Board after considering the proposed increase in estimated maximum

cost has reaffirmed its determination that such action will not have a negative effect on the environment.

WHEREAS, notice of public hearing was duly published and posted in the manner and within the time prescribed by Section 209-d, Section 209-h and Section 202-b of the Town Law, and proof of publication and posting was duly presented to said Town Board; and a public hearing was duly held on June 15, 2015, at which all persons desiring to be heard were duly heard; and

WHEREAS, after giving due consideration to the Amendment No. 2 to Map, Plan and Report and the evidence given at said public hearing, the Town Board, by resolution duly adopted on June 15, 2015, determined that the notice of hearing was duly published and posted as required by law and was otherwise sufficient, and that the proposed increase in the estimated maximum amount of the Extension and Improvements of said Sewer District No. 1 is in the public interest and will not constitute an undue burden on the property which will bear the cost thereof, and approved the increase in the estimated maximum amount of the Extension and Improvements of Greenville Sewer District #1 to an increased estimated maximum amount of \$6,400,000, of which \$4,842,000 is estimated to be allocable to the construction of the Extension and Improvements allocable thereto and \$1,558,000 is estimated to be allocable to the improvement of facilities of Sewer District #1, all as more fully described in the Amendment No. 2 to Map, Plan and Report, and determined that the increased maximum amount proposed to be expended for the construction of the Extension and Improvements referred to herein, which is planned to be financed by the issuance of serial bonds of said Town, and the costs of said Extension and Improvements, including payment of principal of and interest on said bonds, shall be paid by the assessment, levy and collection of special benefit assessments upon the several lots and parcels of land within Sewer District No. 1 and the Extension thereof, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvement shall confer upon the same, subject to permissive referendum; and

WHEREAS, notice of adoption of such resolution subject to permissive referendum was duly published and posted as required by law, and no petition for referendum having been filed within the 30-day statutory period;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDERED, by the Town Board of the Town of Greenville, as follows:

Section 1. The proposed increase in the estimated maximum amount of the Extension and Improvements of said Sewer District No. 1 is in the public interest and will not constitute an undue burden on the property which will bear the cost thereof.

Section 2. The sewer system Improvements hereinabove referred to shall be constructed as set forth in the Amended Map, Plan and Report, at an increased estimated maximum cost not to exceed \$6,400,000. Of such amount, approximately \$4,842,000 represents amounts properly allocable to the existing Sewer District #1 and approximately \$1,558,000 represents amounts allocable to the Extension, to be funded by the issuance of obligations pursuant to the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. The costs of said Extension and Improvements, including payment of principal of and interest on said obligations, shall be paid by the assessment, levy and collection of special benefit assessments upon the several lots and parcels of land within Sewer District #1 and the Extension, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvement shall confer upon the same.

Section 4. Within ten (10) days after adoption of this order, the Town Clerk shall record with the Clerk of the County of Greene and file with the Office of the State Comptroller in Albany, New York, copies of this order, certified by said Town Clerk.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SERIAL BONDS OF THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, GREENE COUNTY, NEW YORK IN AN ADDITIONAL AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,000,000 FOR A TOTAL OF \$6,400,000 PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW TO FINANCE AN EXTENSION OF AND IMPROVEMENT TO FACILITIES OF THE GREENVILLE SEWER DISTRICT #1 IN THE TOWN OF GREENVILLE, NEW YORK, AND DELEGATING CERTAIN POWERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH TO THE TOWN SUPERVISOR.

WHEREAS, the Town of Greenville, Greene County, New York (the "Town") has previously adopted its Bond Resolution dated March 7, 2013 (the "2013 Bond Resolution"), authorizing the issuance of serial bonds for the purposes described herein in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$4,097,000, as supplemented by a Supplemental Bond Resolution adopted December 14, 2014 (the "2014 Supplemental Bond Resolution"), authorizing an additional aggregate principal amount of \$1,303,000, for a total of \$5,400,000;

WHEREAS, the Town has adopted a final order on this date, pursuant to Section 209-d, Section 209-h and Section 202-b of the Town Law, authorizing an increased estimated maximum

amount for the amended extension to the Greenville Sewer District #1 ("Extension") and improvements to Greenville Sewer District #1 ("Improvements"), in the amount of \$6,400,000, and pursuant to the plan of financing proposed in such resolution, it is necessary to authorize the issuance of serial bonds in the additional aggregate principal amount of \$1,000,000, for a total of \$6,400,000;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Greenville, Greene County, New York (the "Town") (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all of the members of the Board) as follows:

SECTION 1. The 2013 Bond Resolution and Supplemental Bond Resolution are hereby amended and supplemented as further set forth in this resolution. The Extension of and Improvements to Greenville Sewer District #1, including the upgrade to the existing wastewater treatment plant to increase the treatment capacity, installation of a gravity sewer collection system, construction of a pump station, construction of a force main to the wastewater plant and related improvements, including original furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus required therefor, are hereby authorized at an increased estimated maximum cost of \$6,400,000, and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. It is hereby determined that said purpose is an object or purpose described in subdivision 4 of paragraph a of Section 11 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probable usefulness of said purpose is forty years.

SECTION 2. It is hereby determined that the aforesaid purpose constitutes a Type I action as defined under the State Environmental Quality Review Regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617, which has been determined under SEQRA not to have a significant impact on the environment.

SECTION 3. It is hereby determined that the proposed maturity of the obligations authorized by this resolution will be in excess of five years from the original date of issuance of such obligation.

SECTION 4. The Town Board has previously authorized the issuance of its serial bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$5,400,000, and pursuant to such authorization, bond anticipation notes in the principal amount of \$2,000,000 have been issued. Nothing in this resolution shall be deemed to impair the obligations so issued or the authorization to issue serial bonds to redeem such obligations. The Town plans to finance the increased cost of the purposes described herein by the issuance of additional serial bonds of the Town in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000, resulting in a total authorized issuance of \$6,400,000, hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the Local Finance Law, and there is hereby authorized the assessment, levy and collection of special assessments upon the several lots and parcels of land within the Greenville Sewer District #1 and Extension which the Town Board shall deem especially benefited by said facilities, so much upon and from each as shall be in just proportion to the amount of benefit which the improvement shall confer upon the same, to pay the principal and interest on said bonds.

SECTION 5. Current funds are not required to be provided prior to the issuance of the bonds authorized by this resolution or any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds.

SECTION 6. The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Section 1.150-2 of the Treasury Regulations.

SECTION 7. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds becoming due and payable in such year. To the extent not paid from other sources, there shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of the Town a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same become due and payable.

SECTION 8. Subject to the terms and contents of this resolution and the Local Finance Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 30.00, 50.00 and 56.00 to 63.00, inclusive, of said Law, the power to authorize bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of the serial bonds authorized by this resolution and the renewals of said notes and the power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of said serial bonds and said bond anticipation notes (including without limitation the date, denominations, maturities, interest payment dates, consolidation with other issues, and redemption rights), the power to determine to issue said bonds providing for substantially level or declining debt service, and the power to sell and deliver said serial bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds, and the power to issue bonds as statutory installment bonds, is hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the Town. The Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to sign any serial bonds issued pursuant to this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of said serial bonds, and the Town Clerk is hereby authorized to affix the corporate seal of the Town to any of said serial bonds or any bond anticipation notes and to attest such seal.

SECTION 9. The Town Supervisor is further authorized to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to ensure the continued status of the interest on the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any notes issued in anticipation thereof, as excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and to designate the bonds authorized by this resolution and any notes issued in anticipation thereof as "qualified tax-exempt bonds" for purposes of Section 265(b)(3)(B)(I) of the Code.

SECTION 10. The Supervisor is further authorized, in his discretion, to execute a note purchase agreement, project financing and loan agreement and any other agreements with the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation and/or the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and/or the New York State Department of Health, and amendments Environmental Conservation and/or the New York State Department of Health, and amendments thereto, and to take such actions and execute such documents as may be necessary to provide for the financing or refinancing of the specific object or purpose set forth herein, or a portion the financing or refinancing of the specific object or purpose set forth herein, or a portion thereof, by a serial bond and/or bond anticipation note issue of the Town and the sale of such issue or issues to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation or its designee.

SECTION 11. The validity of said serial bonds or of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said serial bonds may be contested only if:

- (1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town is not authorized to expend money; or
- (2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with; publication, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after
- the date of such publication; or

 (3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of New York.

SECTION 12. The Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish this resolution, or a summary thereof, together with a notice in substantially the form provided by Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law, in the <u>Catskill Daily Mail</u>, being a newspaper having a general circulation in the Town and hereby designated as the official newspaper of the Town for such publication.

SECTION 13. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
