After my inspection yesterday, it is clear that I&I is impacting the WWTP and I appreciate Zach staying overnight to keep an eye on things. However, my attached cover e-mail/inspection letter from last year asked for a plan to investigate/reduce I&I and to the best of my knowledge, the Department never received any response. I would like to schedule a conference call in the next week or so to discuss this issue with all of you. I believe the WWTP received 158,000 gpd from Monday into Tuesday and the average daily flow is in the range of 30,000 to 40,000 gpd.



Based on information provided during this inspection, a likely source is the nearby elementary school and please note when this work will be completed (preferably before the end of CY 2024).
- 2. Town to discuss the monitoring of the collection system piping/pump station monitoring with North Dome Operations and provide a staffing/monitoring plan
- 3. Provide an update on the status of Sulzer's work at the Hill Street pump station to enable alarms to be sent to North Dome Operations (preferably by text & e-mail)
- 4. The Department also noted the stream bed/banks in the vicinity of the WWTP outfall were recently disturbed and eroded/bare soil was left in place (see attached photographs). I've copied Mike Dudley, Highway Department on this e-mail to direct his staff that such work should not be conducted unless Region 4 Department of Permits and Water are contacted for our review/approval. Please provide a photograph that documents the area (on both sides of the culvert) are properly vegetated or have been seeded/mulched.

The Department has observed a tremendous amount of progress on this project in the past year and note a job well done to Mr. McGrath, North Dome Operations and Mr. Smigel, Delaware Engineering for their efforts.

#### Gentlemen,

Please take a look at the responses to the 4 comments from the DEC. please let me know I you have any edits. I'd like to get this out to Jamie by 3pm today. Thanks!

1. Town and Delaware Engineering to prepare a plan/schedule for investigation of I&I as depicted on site maps (with previous related work and future tasks noted). Based on information provided during this inspection, a likely source is the nearby elementary school and please note when this work will be completed (preferably before the end of CY 2024).

> The Town and Delaware Engineering are working to secure a portable flow meter to verify flows values from different points in the collection system. Based on visual findings, higher flows have been witnessed at the school's connection point to the collection system and from the original collection system, primarily comprising of the housing development called "Country Estates". Conversations have been had with representatives from the school in regards to higher flows but the Town does not own the piping system beyond the connection of the school.

> In conjunction with use of a flow meter, Smoke testing of the perceived problem locations is being coordinated. The school has given permission for the Town (Delaware and North Dome) to perform smoke testing on the school grounds to occur after school is on summer recess (Starting June 30th). Based on findings, the school will be responsible for addressing any corrective actions that are needed on school property. The Town owns and operates the collection system in and around country estates so any corrective measures in that location will be addressed by the Town. We are placing a milestone for completion of smoke testing for July 11th and a report on the findings by July 18th. Any corrective measures needed by the school will be addressed in the report with a milestone set for corrective actions.

2. Town to discuss the monitoring of the collection system piping/pump station monitoring with North Dome Operations and provide a staffing/monitoring plan

> The Town has hired North Dome for monitoring of the collection system and pump stations for the collection system. The main pump station is checked daily as part of North Dome's standard procedures.

3. Provide an update on the status of Sulzer's work at the Hill Street pump station to enable alarms to be sent to North Dome Operations (preferably by text & e-mail)

North Dome is continuing to work with Sulzer on correcting the alarm issue. A new modem has been ordered along with a new sim card to be installed. The firmware for the system has been updated.

4. The Department also noted the stream bed/banks in the vicinity of the WWTP outfall were recently disturbed and eroded/bare soil was left in place (see attached photographs). I've copied Mike Dudley, Highway Department on this e-mail to direct his staff that such work should not be conducted unless Region 4 Department of Permits and Water are contacted for our review/approval. Please provide a photograph that documents the area (on both sides of the culvert) are properly vegetated or have been seeded/mulched.

The Town has adjusted their standard operating procedure to include obtaining the proper permits prior to conducting any work near regulated waterways. Photos of restoration of the disturbed area will be provided under separate email.
