Old Business

The following monthly department reports were given:

Rescue – No representation at this meeting. No motions made

Highway – Highway Superintendent Mike Dudley read the attached report. The shared services agreement from the County was received but tabled for Mike to review.

Building & Grounds – Colin Augstein gave verbal report.

Recycling – Councilman Bear reported that recycling center was operating well.

Water/Sewer – Sarina read the attached report.

Events – Sarina read the attached report.

Assessor – Sole Assessor Hope Nugent read the attached report. Grievance Day is slated for 5/26. The State may reimburse the Town for some of Hope’s trainings.

Planning Board – Chair Don Teator read the attached report. Will Bardel will be presenting at the April meeting to discuss the Comprehensive Plan survey results.

Dog Control – Supervisor Macko read the attached report.

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Beautification – Bill VonAtzingen reported that there will be an Easter Egg Hunt at the North Barn on the last weekend of March and that a \$10k grant was received from Iroquois Pipeline to go towards the Ingall's property purchase.

District #4 Legislator – Greg Davis submitted a memo that was read aloud by Supervisor Macko.

New Business

EMS Payment– Supervisor Macko reported that Greene County sent a check towards EMS/Rescue Services. Another is expected to be received in July.

Mid-Hudson – Supervisor Macko reported that there will be a conference call with Mid-Hudson to discuss the Town's dissatisfaction with their phone services. Town employees and Town Attorney Tal Rappleyea are invited to join.

Pay Loader Lease– *Councilman VonAtzingen motioned, seconded by Councilman Goode to approve the pay loader financing payments of \$36,550.45/year for five years totaling \$182,752.70. Carried 4 ayes*

Kool-Temp Service – *Councilman Bear motioned, seconded by Councilman VonAtzingen to approve the Kool-Temp service club membership platinum plan for \$599/outdoor unit. Carried 4 ayes*

2025 AFR – *Councilman VonAtzingen motioned, seconded by Councilman Bear to approve RBT conducting the 2025 AFR. Carried 4 ayes*

ChargePoint – *Councilman VonAtzingen motioned, seconded by Councilman Bear to begin the removal process for the ChargePoint EV charging station. Carried 4 ayes*

Revolutionary War Plaque – *Councilman VonAtzingen motioned, seconded by Councilman Goode to welcome Joe Sicluna to apply on behalf of the Town of Greenville for funding to place a Revolutionary War Patriots Plaque at the Locust Cemetery. The Town also asked Don Teator to run point on this project. Carried 4 ayes.*

Sweeper Bid – *Councilman Bear motioned, seconded by Councilman VonAtzingen to approve opening the already published sweeper bids on February 27, 2026 at 2:00pm. Carried 4 ayes*
